

Bryce Miller will fly the Marquis Jet colors on two continents this month, driving a pair of Porsche race cars in two major international race series. He will start in the United States, driving a Porsche 911 GT3 RSR in the American Le Mans Series. He'll then travel to Belgium, where he'll compete in the 24 Hours of Spa (part of the FIA GT Championship) in a Porsche 911 GT3 RS.

The American Le Mans Series is the North-American division of endurance racing linked to the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Bryce earned his first ALMS GT2 victory at Road America last year in the No. 87 Marquis Jet race car. He'll return to the series for a two-hour 45-minute race at Lime Rock Park on July 18. He will drive the No. 87 Marquis Jet Porsche 911 GT3 RSR with Porsche factory driver Wolf Henzler of Nürtingen, Germany. The car will be prepared by Farnbacher Loles Racing.

The American Le Mans Series race is set for Saturday, July 18, from 2:05 pm to 4:50 pm ET, on the 1.51-mile Lime Rock Park road course in Lakeville, Conn.

The world's biggest GT race – the 24 Hours of Spa – is next on the agenda. Bryce will make his first start in the historic 24-hour race on the 4.35-mile Circuit de Spa-Francorchamps in Belgium, on July 25 and 26. He will co-drive with Porsche Team drivers Marco Holzer of Bobingen, Germany, and Martin Ragginger of Salzburg, Austria, and their Italian teammate Luigi Lucchini. Their No. 97 Marquis Jet Porsche 911 GT3 RS will be prepared by Brixia Racing. Racing as BMS Scuderia Italia, the team posted a second-place GT2 finish at Le Mans in June.

The 24 Hours of Spa is scheduled from 10 am ET on Saturday, July 25, to 10 am ET on Sunday, July 26, on the 4.35-mile Circuit de Spa-Francorchamps near Liège, Belgium.
